#### The Big Picture: Chosen

Father, the People of God were born in Your heart, out of Your overflowing love, out of Your deep desire to share Yourself with us.

"You did not choose Me but I chose you, and appointed you that you would go and bear fruit." (John 15:16, NASB)

God chose us as He chose Israel in the Old Testament.

Our coming to God, our relationship with Him, was entirely

His idea, His choice, His purpose, His intention, and His doing, out of His love and by His personal sacrifice.

Israel proved unworthy of His choice. God's purpose for them, His destiny for them was fulfilled only in Jesus Christ.

We were chosen to be His personal possession, His special treasure. We were chosen to be uniquely, totally His. We were chosen to be holy,

to be set apart completely to Him. We were chosen for a life of obedience. We were chosen for a life of self-sacrifice, just as was our elder brother, Jesus Christ. We were chosen to be God's children, to live and love like our Father, to bring Him glory and praise. We were chosen to share the Father's beautiful, intimate, seamless relationship with Jesus Christ,

now and forever.

*"Where two or three have gathered in My name, I am there in their midst."* (Matthew 18:20, NASB)



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#### The Big Picture: Called to Oneness


Though God's people remain thoroughly human, the Holy Spirit enables them to know what they couldn't otherwise know and do what they couldn't otherwise do.

My loved ones, I ask you, I beg you, love each other deeply, actively, totally,



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#### The Big Picture: Varied, yet One

Father, You picture the relationship between Your Son and Your people in a number of beautiful ways. We are Your temple, with Christ as the chief cornerstone. We are fruitful branches in Christ, the true vine. We members of His body, with Christ as the head. We are many. We are varied. We are one – one with Him and one with each other.

You are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and are of God's household, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the corner stone, in whom the whole building, being fitted together, is growing into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are being built together into a dwelling of God in the Spirit. (Ephesians 2:19-22, NASB)

#### Jesus said:

*"I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing."* (John 15:5, NASB)

Just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. (Romans 12:4-5, NASB)

#### Blossoming

It started with one Chinese man, a medical research scientist who came to our Sunday School class at the invitation of a co-worker. Soon his wife was attending with him, then two more couples, fellow scientists from mainland China.

They were spiritually and culturally curious. They wanted to learn more about the life and language of America. But having been raised in an atheistic society, they also came with spiritual questions.

We soon found that because of their limited language skills and biblical knowledge, our regular Sunday School class wasn't enough for them. So we began meeting with them an hour before class. It was Bible 101. We started by introducing them to the scriptures from the ground up. Then we watched the *Jesus* film together, discussing each scene one by one. At the end, our version of the film addressed dozens of basic questions about the Christian faith. We used those questions to lead our friends into a greater understanding of life in Christ. Next, we began reading through Genesis together, talking and teaching as we went.

Those two-and-one-half years were memorable in so many ways. I remember our first Christmas with them. We brought in a small manger scene, and from us they heard that magnificent story for the very first time.

I remember the Sunday we encouraged them to pray the sinner's prayer along with us. With all the barriers of language and spiritual understanding, we wondered how much had gotten through to them.

But I particularly remember one man blossoming in his faith. In spite of a horrendous work schedule, Jinyu began praying daily. He read the Bible on his own, bringing in questions that showed he was thinking about it broadly and deeply. He began witnessing to his Chinese friends. He asked us about ancestor worship, knowing that when he next gathered with his family in China, they would expect him to participate.

But my favorite memory is the morning he came in beaming, saying that he had been asked to read scripture in our main worship service. We were pleased along with him, but also surprised. Jinyu was a gentle, sweet-spirited man who struggled with his English. Our church was large, and scripture readers were chosen for their speaking ability. We wondered how well his reading would be understood.

That morning service focused on missions. It included a parade of flags, special music, and a missionary speaker. When it came time for the morning scripture reading, a half dozen or so people came forward. Together they read Psalm 98, each one reading selected verses in a foreign language.

Jinyu read, not in English, but in Chinese, and we were stunned! We had only heard him speak in English, his second language. His speaking was always halting and broken. We had never heard the man who read that morning. He was bold, strong, and fluent. He was eloquent! He was speaking in his own native language. He was at home. He was fully himself.

As I reflect back on that morning, I think about the Body of Christ. I think about all the personalities and cultures that make it up, in all their God-given diversity. What would the Body be like if each of its members were fully, completely themselves? What if all that individuality could blossom into the beauty and variety intended by our Creator, yet still remain one in Christ? Squeezing living things into narrow, artificial molds is constrictive and stifling. It is unnatural. Becoming all our Creator intended us to be is wonderfully freeing and enriching, both to the individual and to the Body. An eye makes a better eye than it does an arm.

That freedom, that blossoming is coming. In fact, it is happening right now as the Holy Spirit nurtures and renews each individual. He assures us that the One who began this good work in us will complete it (Philippians 1:6). Each flower will blossom into its full uniqueness, lovingly nurtured by its Creator. Together, what a garden we will be!

Each of us will speak our own native language, fluently and eloquently. And in Christ all those individual expressions will blend into one universal language: the language of truth; the language of pure love.





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#### The Big Picture: The Bride of Christ

Perhaps the most beautiful and intimate picture scripture draws of God's people is this: the Bride of Christ.

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her, so that He might sanctify her by the washing of water with the word, so that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she should be holy and blameless. (Ephesians 5:25-27, NASB)

Psalm 45 speaks to us as to the bride of a great King – the King of Kings. It urges us to focus completely on our new role, on who we are and who we are becoming in Christ:

Listen, O daughter, give attention and incline your ear; Forget your people and your father's house... In place of your fathers will be your sons; You shall make them princes in all the earth. (Psalm 45:10, 16, NASB)

The Apostle Paul drew on the same picture when he warned the Corinthians:

I am jealous for you with a godly jealousy; for I betrothed you to one husband, so that to Christ I might present you as a pure virgin. But I am afraid that, as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, your minds will be led astray from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ. (2 Corinthians 11:2-3, NASB)

#### **Christ in Psalm 45**

As God's Church, what is our destiny? For what is God preparing us? What is the goal toward which He is leading us? Our future is full and perfect union with His holy, human Son, Jesus Christ. We are engaged to Him. As His people, we are His betrothed, His fiancé. Our destiny is to be His beautiful bride, joyfully one with Him, united in heart, in mind, in purpose. We will fully, eternally share His life. His love, His radiant glory, and His intimate presence. So let's remember who we are and live like it. Let's share His heart. Let's love as He loves, serve as He serves, and sacrifice ourselves as He sacrificed Himself, freely and without reserve. Let's live and love as the future bride of Jesus Christ, the King of all Kings.


# Christ and His Bride

Revelation 21:1-11



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#### The Big Picture: The Bride Takes Her Place

As the Bride of Christ, we will take our place in God's glorious, new creation.

As you read John's description of the New Jerusalem, think of it not as buildings, but as a people – the Bride of the Lamb, the People of God.

Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues came and spoke with me, saying, "Come here, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb."

And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great and high mountain, and showed me the holy city, Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, having the glory of God. Her brilliance was like a very costly stone, as a stone of crystalclear jasper. It had a great and high wall, with twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels; and names were written on them, which are the names of the twelve tribes of the sons of Israel. There were three gates on the east and three gates on the north and three gates on the south and three gates on the west.

And the wall of the city had twelve foundation stones, and on them were the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

The one who spoke with me had a gold measuring rod to measure the city, and its gates and its wall. The city is laid out as a square, and its length is as great as the width; and he measured the city with the rod, fifteen hundred miles; its length and width and height are equal. And he measured its wall, seventy-two yards, according to human measurements, which are also angelic measurements.

The material of the wall was jasper; and the city was pure gold, like clear glass. The foundation stones of the city wall were adorned with every kind of precious stone. The first foundation stone was jasper; the second, sapphire; the third, chalcedony; the fourth, emerald; the fifth, sardonyx; the sixth, sardius; the seventh, chrysolite; the eighth, beryl; the ninth, topaz; the tenth, chrysoprase; the eleventh, jacinth; the twelfth, amethyst.

And the twelve gates were twelve pearls; each one of the gates was a single pearl. And the street of the city was pure gold, like transparent glass. (Revelation 21:9-21, NASB)
