Introduction

Too often the truth of the Trinity is dismissed as dry, theoretical, and incomprehensible. But this truth about God is as rich and meaningful as He is. Like all other aspects of His nature, it glows with His unfailing love (grace) and absolute dependability (truth). The Trinity: God Engulfs Us in Himself is a brief tapestry of scriptures, reflections, prayers, and hymns. It does not pretend to be a complete treatment of the subject. Its intent is to bring out just a bit of the rich reality that is the Trinity: God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; And as such, He envelops us human creatures in all He is.

We fail to grasp the wonderful reality of God because in our small and self-centered hearts, we cannot conceive any Being so much greater than ourselves.

In the Beginning, Father, Son, and Spirit

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of the waters. (Genesis 1:1-2, NASB)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being. In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men. (John 1:1-4, NASB)

All that has been, all that is, all that will be is the story of Father and Son. All reality flows from them and from the Spirit they share.

Father and Son are closer than our limited understanding can imagine two personalities being. They are closer than thought and word, than light and radiance. They are as inseparable as a loving heart and loving hands. They are different persons sharing one Life, one Love, one Being, one Breath. The Breath they share between them is their Spirit. He is their life in motion, blowing like the wind, moving, giving, loving.

Complete in power,

complete in wisdom, their boundless love overflowed into worlds upon worlds. The Father willed, the Son worked, and their mighty Breath brooded over what was still empty and unformed. From their willing and working and breathing came a rich banquet of spiritual and sensual reality: light and life, fire and air. water and land. plants and animals, color and sound. All reality was aglow with the magnificence of Father, Son, and Spirit. Then the One Being spoke from the perfection of their life and love and oneness: "Let us make a being in our image." The Father willed. and the Son worked. and the Breath breathed, and behold, a human being, created to will and work and breathe, to live and create and rule in this garden world. Then to complete the human, the one became two two beings, one flesh, so they could live the loving unity of Father, Son, and Spirit. The One Being saw everything they had made, and it was good.


It was very good!

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Fall and Incarnation

John 1:10-14; Genesis 2 – 3

He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John 1:10-14, NASB)

Father, Son, and Spirit gifted the humans with the freedom

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The Father and Spirit in the Son's Ministry

Jesus the incarnate Son was one with the Father through the Spirit He had been one with the Father through all eternity. (John 1:1-2) He became flesh by the Holy Spirit conceiving Him in the womb of the virgin Mary. (Luke 1:35) Jesus began His ministry at His baptism by humbling Himself to bear our sins. As He did, the Father and Spirit testified to the Son, both visibly and audibly: Now when all the people were baptized, and while He was praying, heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove, and a voice came out of heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in You I am wellpleased." (Luke 3:21-22, NASB) Throughout His ministry, Jesus only said what the Father gave Him to say. "Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father is in Me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on My own initiative, but the Father abiding in Me does His works." (John 14:10, NASB) How could a human being only, always speak the words of God? The Holy Spirit enabled Him. The Son. Whom the Father has sent, speaks the very words of God; for the Father gives Him the Spirit without any limits. (John 3:34, para.) No matter how we stretch, we cannot wrap our imaginations around Almighty God.




Our imaginations cannot encompass the Almighty Triune God. But He encompasses us, body and soul, imagination and spirit, every breath and throughout eternity.

(John 15:26; 16:13-15, NASB)

Who completely understands the Trinity, how Three Persons can be One Being and One Being can be Three Persons?

Yet all who receive God's Spirit experience the Trinity. We share in their love and unity. We taste their oneness and their individuality.

The Father showed His heart, His mind, and His deep love for us beautifully and completely in Christ. The Holy Spirit speaks this revelation to individuals all over the world. He makes the truth in Christ universal, constant, and personal.

The Father made Himself human in Jesus. He became small, earthly, and touchable. The Holy Spirit takes Jesus beyond the limits of a physical body and breathes Him all around us and within us.






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Sharing in the Trinity


Jesus ushers us into the full unity, love, and fellowship of Father, Son, and Spirit.

In You we live and move and have our being. Today, Lord, help us worship You for all You are!



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At Home with the Father, Son, and Spirit

"If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our abode with him." (John 14:23, NASB) Earlier in this same chapter, in John 14:1-3, Jesus said that the Father's house has many "dwelling places" and that He will come again and take us to live with Him forever. But then He says, in v. 23 (see above), that if we love the Father, He will love us and come to us and make His "abode" with us here and now. The NIV translates "abode" (NASB) as "home." But actually, it's the same Greek word as "dwelling places" in v. 1. The God who will one day return to take us to His home (14:1-3) makes His home with us even now -Father, Son, and Spirit (14:23). Here in this world, the triune God dwells with us, humble and human as we are. They know us, flaw by flaw, yet They gladly join their life to ours. We share Their love, Their peace, Their joy. We breathe Their breath. They live in us, and we in Them. Their holy life is a growing part of our own. Our togetherness has a beautiful beginning now and a glorious completion hereafter. Our satisfaction in God and our rest in Him are not limited by time or place. They are not just someday. They are here and now and forever as we simply trust Him.

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Sharing Jesus' Father-Son Relationship

Read John 14:6-27

Jesus' relationship with His Father was surprising and intriguing. But consider this: Jesus longs to share that relationship with each of us. He longs for us to participate in the love that flows unhindered among the Father, Son, and Spirit:

"I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him...We will come to him and make our home with him." (John 14:20-21, 23, NIV)

Jesus is a living example of what our relationship with our Father can be. He is the living truth about what God wants for each of His children.

- Complete sufficiency in every situation
- Complete peace, joy, and love
- Complete dependence on the Father
- Complete emptiness before the Father as the key to sharing His strength
- The security of knowing that we only say what the Father tells us to say and only do what the Father shows us to do

How does this happen? How do we come to share in Jesus' relationship with His Father? By a growing trust in the Father and a growing reliance on the Spirit of Jesus within us.

Study the life of Jesus, especially in the Gospel of John. Pay particular attention to what He says about His relationship with His Father. As you see how He lived, all through faith, the hunger will grow in you to share His beautiful, simple relationship with the Father. The Father, the Son, and the Spirit all deeply desire to share that relationship with you.

There is a perpetual humility of the Son toward the Father that I find so beautiful (1 Corinthians 15:28). There is no jostling for position between them, and there need be none in our thinking about them. Each of us, all of us can enter into their beautiful, perfectly-peaceful, perfectly-loving, perfectly-united relationship through Jesus Christ.

The Spirit tunes each of us to the Father and Son.


Our unity with each other is a by-product of our union with them.



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All the Fullness of God

In [Christ] all the fullness of Deity dwells in bodily form, and in Him we have been made complete (Colossians 2:9-10, NASB). And through the Spirit of Christ within, we can be filled up to all the fullness of God (Ephesians 3:19, NASB). What a beautiful reality it is for individuals to enjoy the fullness of God within and to be made complete in Christ! But when we trace the idea of "fullness" through Ephesians, we discover an even grander truth. God paints on a broader, more glorious canvas than we can imagine! Ephesians 1:10 says that in the *fullness of the times*, God will sum up all things in Christ, all things in heaven and on earth. Think of it! All reality one with Christ! Ephesians 1:22-23 says that we the Church are the very body of the glorious, exalted Christ. We are the fullness of Him who fills all in all! Ephesians 3:17-19 says that we know the full dimensions of God's unknowable love with all the saints, in fellowship with God's people. Only together will we fully grasp and experience God's indescribable love. Ephesians 4 urges us to use our Christ-given gifts to equip each other for service, to build up the Body of Christ, until together we become fully mature, measuring up to the full stature of the fullness of Christ (4:30). In its ultimate form, in its highest fulfillment, the fullness of God -Father, Son, and Spirit – will be not just a Christlike individual, but a Christlike society, an entire race that is so one with Christ that it can only be described as His bride...as His own body. In a very real sense, our magnificent triune God will be incarnate, not just in a Person, but in a people.
