

#### Isaiah 7:1-16

(NASB)

Now it came about in the days of Ahaz, the son of Jotham, the son of Uzziah, king of Judah, that Rezin the king of Aram and Pekah the son of Remaliah, king of Israel, went up to Jerusalem to wage war against it, but could not conquer it. When it was reported to the house of David, saying, "The Arameans have taken a stand by Ephraim," his heart and the hearts of his people shook as the trees of the forest shake from the wind.

Then the Lord said to Isaiah, "Go out now to meet Ahaz, you and your son Shear-jashub, at the end of the conduit of the upper pool, on the road to the fuller's field, and say to him, 'Take care and be calm, have no fear and do not be fainthearted because of these two stumps of smoldering logs, on account of the fierce anger of Rezin and Aram and the son of Remaliah. Because Aram, with Ephraim and the son of Remaliah, has planned evil against you, saying, "Let's go up against Judah and terrorize it, and take it for ourselves by assault and set up the son of Tabeel as king in the midst of it," this is what the Lord God says: "It shall not stand nor shall it come to pass. For the head of Aram is Damascus, and the head of Damascus is Rezin (now within another sixty-five years Ephraim will be broken to pieces, so that it is no longer a people), and the head of Ephraim is Samaria, and the head of Samaria is the son of Remaliah. If you will not believe, you certainly shall not last.""

Then the Lord spoke again to Ahaz, saying, "Ask for a sign for yourself from the Lord your God; make it deep as Sheol or high as heaven." But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, nor will I put the Lord to the test!" Then he said, "Listen now, house of David! Is it too trivial a thing for you to try the patience of men, that you will try the patience of my God as well?

Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and she will name Him Immanuel.

He will eat curds and honey at the time He knows enough to refuse evil and choose good. For before the boy knows enough to refuse evil and choose good, the land whose two kings you dread will be abandoned.

## **Immanuel: The Original Situation**

One of the most familiar prophecies of Messiah is this:

Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel - that is, God is with us. (Isaiah 7:14, NASB with center column note)

We hear the verse every Christmas, but we rarely consider the real-life situation from which the prophecy comes.

It was the late 700's B.C., and Ahaz was the ungodly king of Judah, the southern Jewish kingdom. The country had enjoyed prosperity under his godly father, Jotham, and his grandfather, Uzziah. But now the aggressive ruler of Assyria had the surrounding nations concerned. He had imposed a heavy tribute on them, and they were tired of paying. They needed Judah to join with them in an alliance against powerful Assyria, but King Ahaz had refused. He was considering doing the opposite: going to Assyria for protection against the alliance. There had already been violence, and Ahaz and Judah were frightened.

God took the initiative to send the prophet Isaiah to Ahaz to reassure him. He was urging Ahaz not to fear the alliance and to trust God rather than turn to Assyria for help. Judah had often gotten in trouble politically and had displeased God by making such foreign alliances, which were deals with the devil. Through Isaiah, God was urging Ahaz not to do it again.

Isaiah came out to meet Ahaz while the king was checking the water supply - probably making sure it wouldn't be cut off during a siege.

Notice Isaiah's reassuring message in Isaiah 7:4-9:

- Don't be afraid! (v.4)
- These two supposed firebrands (the alliance) are only smoldering stubs that is, their fire has already been put out. (v.4)
- They have planned evil against you, but the Sovereign God of History will not let it happen. (vv.5-7)
- These two "powerful" nations both boil down to their respective kings, and these kings will come to nothing. Within 65 years Ephraim (the northern Jewish kingdom of Israel) will be completely destroyed (and it was). (vv.8-9a)
- Don't be afraid of them. Be afraid of not trusting Me! Lack of faith in Me is the real danger you're facing. (v.9b)

How did Ahaz react to God's assurance? The story continues next.

## **Immanuel: A Mysterious Prophecy**

King Ahaz and his country, Judah, were being threatened by two of their neighbors. Ahaz was frightened and wanted to run to their powerful enemy, Assyria, for protection. God was warning him not to do that. God's assurance was that the threat from their neighbors would come to nothing. He warned Ahaz that if he didn't stand by faith, he would not stand at all.

Knowing that Ahaz's faith was weak to non-existent, God told him to ask for a sign. God offered to perform any miracle Ahaz would name, just to assure him that God would indeed protect him (vv.10-11).

Ahaz refused, pretending that he didn't want to test God by asking for a sign (v.12). His refusal was sheer hypocrisy. He knew that asking for a sign would have obligated him to obey God if the sign were given. Ahaz had no intention of obeying God or trusting Him. His mind was made up.

So in vv.13-16, God said, "Fine! You won't ask a sign. I'll give you one anyway." The sign was stated like an important announcement. A "virgin" would conceive. There has been lots of discussion about the meaning of that Hebrew term. It's not primarily sexual. It refers to a young woman, usually an unmarried woman. Perhaps "maiden" is a close equivalent.

A "child" would be born. Is the prophecy referring ahead to its ultimate fulfillment in Jesus? Or is the short-term reference to a child born during that time period - perhaps a child of King Ahaz, or of Isaiah himself (see Isaiah 8:1-4)? We're not told.

"Curds" is curdled milk. Curds and honey were sometimes considered royal food. But they could also be food still available when the land was not being cultivated, such as during lean times or during widespread destruction.

In any case, God's word to Ahaz was this: in the period of time it takes a baby to grow to the point of knowing right from wrong, your enemies would be destroyed.

So how does this prophecy, so shrouded in mystery, point us to Jesus Christ? More next.

#### **Immanuel: God with Us**

Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel - that is, God is with us. (Isaiah 7:14, NASB with center column note)

Based on what we've said in the previous two articles, how does this mysterious prophecy, spoken in a different era and situation, relate to Jesus Christ? What does it tell us about Him? Consider how the original prophecy points to the birth of Jesus:

- The phrasing of the announcement indicated that the birth should be considered a momentous event.
- An air of mystery would surround the identity of the child and his "virgin" mother.
- The Child's birth would be a tangible sign of God's loving intervention on behalf of His people.
- He would come at a time when God's people were in need and under serious threat.
- The Child would be given, not as a reward for their faith, but in spite of their unbelief. He would be given graciously and unilaterally by God. God's greatest gift would be totally undeserved.
- Even His name would be full of comfort and assurance: God with Us.
- The Child's birth and name were to persuade people not to trust in human resources but in God alone. His coming would bolster faith in God.
- The Child's coming would be tangible proof and an ongoing reminder that God keeps His promises.

Jesus' birth was the most momentous event in the history of our race. Though His coming was shrouded in mystery, and many of our questions about Him remain unanswered, we know that He is living proof of God's love and undeserved grace. He is God's clearest call to simple, life-giving faith. Most importantly, Jesus Christ is the ultimate embodiment of our Father's endless desire to be *God with Us*.

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### Isaiah 8:21 - 9:5

(NASB)

They will pass through the land dejected and hungry, and it will turn out that when they are hungry, they will become enraged and curse their king and their God as they face upward. Then they will look to the earth, and behold, distress and darkness, the gloom of anguish; and they will be driven away into darkness.

But there will be no more gloom for her who was in anguish. In earlier times He treated the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali with contempt, but later on He will make it glorious, by the way of the sea, on the other side of the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles.

The people who walk in darkness
Will see a great light;
Those who live in a dark land,
The light will shine on them.
You will multiply the nation,
You will increase their joy;
They will rejoice in Your presence
As with the joy of harvest,
As people rejoice when they divide the spoils.
For You will break the yoke of their burden and the staff on their shoulders,

For every boot of the marching warrior in the roar of battle,
And cloak rolled in blood, will be for burning, fuel for the fire.

## The Blessings of the King

Isaiah spoke these words from God to a people who refused to trust Him. They preferred a religion more accommodating to their lifestyle, more touchable, more socially acceptable, one that catered to their desires. In troubled times when they needed help, they turned to another country, or another god, or to their own abilities or wealth. They consulted mediums, looking to the dead for help. Does any of this sound familiar?

Isaiah 8:21-22 describes the fate of all who worship "gods" that are not God. They feed on what can never satisfy them. The result is hunger, fear, darkness, anger, gloom, and ultimate disappointment. Desperate, they curse all authority. They ignore God their entire lives, then when tough times come, they blame Him. Rejecting Him, they have separated themselves from the only source of life and all that is good.

But look at the first word in the very next verse: "nevertheless" (Isaiah 9:1, NIV). God doesn't reject us when we reject Him. His love pursues us. He doesn't wait for us to deserve His gifts, or even to seek them. He longs to bless us, and He will not give up.

His blessings would begin among those who had suffered the most. Zebulun and Naphtali were the northernmost tribes of Israel, near the Sea of Galilee. Because of their location, they were the first to be attacked by invaders, who often came from the north, and they were the most subject to corruption from surrounding heathen nations.

Jesus was raised in this area and spent most of his life there. He grew up in Nazareth, as an adult moved to Capernaum, and began His ministry in the region of Galilee. (See Matthew 4:12-16.)

God was determined to lift these deluded, oppressed people. His words are bursting at the seams with promised blessings.

Imagine those who had long been engulfed in darkest gloom, now suddenly bathed in beautiful sunlight!

Imagine those consumed with anger and need, now caught up in utter joy — joy that surpasses even our greatest times of abundance and jubilation!

Imagine those long enslaved and oppressed, now suddenly set completely free! It would be as exhilarating as when Gideon delivered them from the Midianites, in Judges 6 & 7.

Imagine all the tools of war, conflict, suffering, and death being destroyed in one massive bonfire, never to be used again!

God was longing to give them a glimpse of a happiness that was beyond their imagining. Our world and our entire lives have been darkened by separation from God. We have no experience to help us grasp the light, the joy, and the freedom that our loving God plans to lavish on His people.

All these blessings would come to us in one perfect and surprising Gift!

## The Magnificence of the King

The previous portion of Isaiah 9, verses 2-5, spoke of a crescendo of incredible blessings: light, joy, abundance, freedom, victory, and peace. How would all these unimaginable gifts arrive?

Now the answer comes: a child, a son would be born. All our care, all our leadership and welfare would be on His shoulders. And what kind of leader, what kind of king would He be? If names could describe the true character and significance of a person, what would His names be? As the earlier passage struggled to communicate the depth and breadth of the gifts He would bring, here human language struggles to capture the majesty of all He is. Translating a bit more literally, His names would be:

Wonder of a Counselor—His wisdom would be truly extraordinary!

Colossians 2:3 says that in Christ are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

His name would be *God of Might*. He would be a mighty warrior, a great champion. He would be Sovereign God.

Jesus...said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Matthew 28:18, NIV)

His name would be *Father of Eternity*. This King would have the tenderness of a Father whose love is unfailing and forever.

Jesus said, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest...My yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30, NIV)

His name would be *Prince of Peace*. Peace is not just the absence of conflict. It is a positive word, encompassing all the best of life: completeness, harmony, and well-being. It is full and unimpaired relationships in every aspect of life.

Philippians 4:7 promises this: *The peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.* (Philippians 4:7, NIV)

Incredible wisdom, sovereign power, unfailing love, and complete well-being—this King will bring us all the qualities of God Himself.

What's more, His rule and the peace He brings will continue to increase forever—not by force, but by justice and righteousness, by doing all that is good and right. The perfect will of our loving Father will blossom and grow in every life, throughout the universe.

These magnificent promises come with a guarantee, at the end of verse 7:

The deep, burning, unquenchable love of the Great I AM, Lord of all the Heavenly Armies, will do this!

Now that's a guarantee!

These verses promise what we deeply desire: the continual increase of His rule, His will, His character, and His peace in our minds, hearts, and lives. That process, that growth has begun already in everyone who trusts Him. The darkness is gone, and the Light has come. Here and now we are tasting His wisdom, His power, His unfailing love, and His deep peace, all through the Spirit of Jesus Christ within. And we are "confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." (Philippians 1:6, NIV)

Lord of all things in this world and the next,
all things seen and unseen,
in heaven and earth.
We are secure and
eternally, extravagantly blessed in Him.







### Isaiah 11:2-5

(NASB)

The Spirit of the Lord will rest on Him, The spirit of wisdom and understanding, The spirit of counsel and strength, The spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.

And He will delight in the fear of the Lord, And He will not judge by what His eyes see, Nor make decisions by what His ears hear;

But with righteousness He will judge the poor, And decide with fairness for the humble of the earth; And He will strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, And with the breath of His lips He will slay the wicked.

Also righteousness will be the belt around His hips, And faithfulness the belt around His waist.

## Messiah and the Holy Spirit

Seven hundred years before Jesus' birth, the prophet Isaiah foretold that Messiah would be a man of the Spirit.

The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (Isaiah 11:2, NIV)

"Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him." (Isaiah 42:1, NIV)

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to preach good news to the poor."
(Isaiah 61:1, NIV)

Not only would Messiah be fully equipped with the Spirit, but He would pour out that Spirit on all God's people. Hear the testimony of John the Baptist at Jesus' baptism:

"I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. I would not have known him, except that the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is he who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' I have seen and I testify that this is the Son of God." (John 1:32-34, NIV)

Throughout the events of Jesus' birth, before Jesus even appears, the Spirit is already doing His work. First, hear Luke 1:13-15 (NIV):

The angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John...He will be filled with the **Holy Spirit** even from birth."

Hear also Luke 1:30-35 (NIV):

The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus..." "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" The angel answered, "The **Holy Spirit** will come upon you, and the power of the Most

High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God."

Listen to what happens when Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth:

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the **Holy Spirit**. In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear." (Luke 1:41-42, NIV)

The Spirit spoke through Zechariah at the circumcision of John the Baptist:

[John's] father Zechariah was filled with the **Holy Spirit** and prophesied: "Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come and has redeemed his people."
(Luke 1:67-68, NIV)

When Mary and Joseph took the infant Jesus to the temple, the Spirit testified to Him through Simeon:

There was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation." (Luke 2:25-30, NIV)

Later, when Jesus' earthly ministry was drawing to a close, He would tell His disciples:

"When the Counselor comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father, he will testify about me. He will bring glory to me by taking from what is mine and making it known to you." (John 15:26; 16:14, NIV)

We see the Spirit already filling that role during Jesus' birth. He testifies to Jesus through Elizabeth, Zechariah, Simeon, and even through John the Baptist when he is still in his mother's womb.

In both Old Testament Hebrew and New Testament Greek, the word translated as "spirit" also means "wind" and "breath". The Spirit is the Wind of God, the Breath of God. He is God's life and power in motion. As such, He is the one who plants God's divine life in the womb of the virgin Mary.

Jesus Christ came in the power of the Spirit, lived in the power of the Spirit, and rose in the power of the Spirit. When He returned to His Father, He poured out that same Spirit on all believers. This Spirit is Messiah's gift to all who trust Him. The Spirit of Christ is your eternal birthright as a child of God. Live in Him. Speak in Him. Minister in Him. Love in Him.

Father, today, in every situation, I want the Spirit of Jesus to shape the way I think, speak, and react.

## **Kingdom of Peace**

Peace begins in God.

It begins with His completeness in Himself and with the love and perfect unity among the Father, Son, and Spirit.

Peace comes to us in Christ.

He who is one with the Father and one with the Spirit became one of us.

And as we simply trust Him, like child.

And as we simply trust Him, like children, He becomes one *with* us.

When Christ has finished what He has started, when we are one with Him, we will be one with the Father and one with the Spirit as well.

As we are one with them,

we will also be one with each other, and the peace of God will be perfect and complete.

Creation itself will then be transformed.

As Romans 8 says:

"Behold, My Servant, whom I uphold;

### The Servant King

Hear the affection and enthusiasm in God's voice as He talks about this Special One. God takes particular delight in Him. Note that this is the same way God spoke of Jesus at His baptism, when Jesus was revealed in His humility (Luke 3:21-22), and at His transfiguration, when Jesus was revealed in His glory (Luke 9:35).

God says that He himself has chosen Him, and He will uphold Him. He will equip Him with His own Spirit (see also Isaiah 11:2).

This Chosen One will need this equipping, for His task is a huge one: to establish justice on earth. He will fully establish God's will, God's rightness, God's own character, throughout all creation, in every aspect of society, in every human relationship, and within every heart. He will rid a very unjust world and a very unjust people of all injustice. What a responsibility!

But notice that God calls Him "my Servant." Elsewhere in Isaiah He describes Him as a Mighty Deliverer and the King of All Kings, One who would rule completely, everywhere and forever (Isaiah 9:6). A sovereign king and a servant? This seems like a strange combination of descriptions for the same person.

But think of the qualities of a good servant:

- obedient
- humble, not calling attention to himself.
- selfless, focused only on the agenda and will of his master;
- single-minded, completely devoted to the task

These qualities match the way the Servant will approach His task. Though the work seems overwhelming, notice the unlikely way He will accomplish it.

- He will not shout or cry out.
- He will not raise His voice in the streets or call attention to himself.
- He will be so gentle that He won't break a bent blade of grass nor snuff out the final smoldering of a candle wick.

What a way to conquer the world! Social activists plan public protests and shout their causes in the streets. Politicians spend millions of dollars to fill every communications medium with their voices and images. Conquerors mount military campaigns with brute force, crushing anyone who gets in their way.

This Leader, this Conqueror is humble and gentle and refuses self-promotion. But don't mistake His methods for weakness. He will not falter. He will not be discouraged. And He will fully accomplish His task.

This is my favorite Old Testament picture of Christ. This is the Servant I see in the gospels: single-minded, obedient to His Father, completely dependent on Him, and totally devoted to His will and His glory. He doesn't call attention to Himself. In fact, we're told that when He healed people, He demanded that they not spread the word about what He had done for them (see Matthew 12:15-21).

He was humble. He came as seemingly the illegimate son of a peasant girl. He was born in a stable and cradled in an animals' feeding trough because He had no other place. As an adult, He traveled the country without a home. He operated outside human authority. He was as an outcast, scorned as a heretic and a madman. And though completely non-violent and non-political, He was brutally executed as an enemy of church and state.

Yet He will succeed where all others have failed. He will conquer the earth forever and establish perfect justice everywhere, at every level, in every human heart.

This is the Savior I know. I recognize Him. This is the way He works in my life. He is so very gentle and patient, yet so persistent and faithful. I have failed more times than I care to remember. I'm such a slow learner. But He never gets impatient with me or in a rush. He doesn't give up on me, and He doesn't leave me in my sin. He continues to work to establish God's beautiful rightness in absolutely every corner of my life.

What a King! What a Servant! What a Savior!

Father, let all I am be consumed by a passion to glorify Jesus Christ. I want everyone to fully realize just how marvelous He is!

He was oppressed and afflicted, Yet He did not open His mouth; Like a lamb that is led to slaughter, And like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, So He did not open His mouth. By oppression and judgment He was taken away;
And as for His generation, who considered
That He was cut off from the land of the living
For the wrongdoing of my people, to whom the blow was due?
And His grave was assigned with wicked men,
Yet He was with a rich man in His death,
Because He had done no violence,
Nor was there any deceit in His mouth.

But the Lord desired To crush Him, causing Him grief; If He renders Himself as a guilt offering, He will see His offspring, He will prolong His days, And the good pleasure of the Lord will prosper in His hand. As a result of the anguish of His soul, He will see it and be satisfied; By His knowledge the Righteous One, My Servant, will justify the many, For He will bear their wrongdoings. Therefore, I will allot Him a portion with the great, And He will divide the plunder with the strong, Because He poured out His life unto death, And was counted with wrongdoers; Yet He Himself bore the sin of many, And interceded for the wrongdoers.

### **Sharing His Suffering**

Lord, when I'm dealing with disappointment, what a comfort to turn to You and think of Your sufferings. Thinking of You turns my world right-side-up. Thinking of Your sufferings when I am "suffering" brings me comfort and joy.

When my suffering is unjust, it is lost in Your greater suffering. It finds meaning in You. I realize that my suffering is some small part of Your work, Your mercy, Your salvation. The apostle Paul felt that his sufferings were somehow completing Your suffering (Colossians 1:24). I realize that when I lay my life down in Your service--not in mere intention, but in action--my destiny becomes wrapped up in Yours. I share Your suffering. I will share Your glory (2 Timothy 2:11-12).

When my suffering is a sad part of life, beyond my control, I realize that You suffered. You understand suffering. I often think of You as holy, omnipotent, perfect God, high above and detached from my gritty struggles. But when I suffer, I'm reminded that You, the God I know, with whom I live face-to-face, have been scarred and shaped by suffering yourself. It's part of Your personal experience. It's who You are--I can see it in Your eyes.

How amazing that Holy God would come to earth and become known as the "Man of Sorrows." You have felt as I feel, and I find sympathy with You: You "feel along with" me. Our suffering becomes something we share, as my spouse and I share the suffering we've endured for our children. Our hearts, Yours and mine, are bonded together by our pain.

When my suffering is the result of my own sin, I find in You the Fountain of mercy and tenderness. You long only for my forgiveness and restoration, not recrimination and punishment. I experience again how complete is salvation. You want not only to forgive my sin but also to heal it to its core. You work patiently but persistently to banish sin's awful curse from my life, completely and forever.

Lord Jesus, thank You for the wonderful gifts You give through suffering. Our pain brings us a fuller, sweeter understanding of life here and hereafter. It is part of turning loose of what is temporary and grasping what is eternal and of infinite value.




