

#### Six Wishes

Have you ever noticed how short and simple is the model prayer Jesus taught us, the Lord's Prayer? Nothing long-winded and fancy. Short phrases. Simple words.

The shape is also simple. The prayer is framed by an opening, *Our Father in heaven*, and a closing, *for yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.* The body of the prayer is six short petitions:

Hallowed be your name
Your kingdom come
Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven
Give us today our daily bread
Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors
Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one

Think about this for a moment. What if God were to give you six wishes? You could ask for these wishes each and every day. What would they be? Money, health, comfort, a fulfilling life?

But look at the "six wishes" Jesus gives us in the Lord's Prayer. Our loving heavenly Father knows and wants what's best for us. What does He tell us to ask for every day? None of our typical requests are anywhere on the list.

Have you ever listened to children when they're on an outing? It doesn't matter what magnificent sights are all around them. Their requests are, "I'm thirsty," "I'm tired," "Do we have to . . . ?" "Is it lunchtime yet?" They react out of temporary desires. They speak out of pain, fatigue, or false expectations. They don't know what's best for them. They can't see the whole picture. They're entirely wrapped up in their own immediate comfort.

As God's children, we tend to react the same way. What we ask from God often has very little to do with our real happiness. We don't know what's best for us.

So why does our Father give us these six petitions to pray every day? The first three teach submission, asking for God's will. The last three teach dependence, asking for God's daily provision and deliverance from sin.

Why these six? Because they focus first and foremost on our relationship with our Father. They say, "Father, I need You. I need Your will, Your provision, Your forgiveness, Your protection."

The Lord's Prayer focuses on our relationship with God our Father, for that is the key to happiness. That relationship is the key to peace, strength, and harmony in every aspect of life.

What kind of relationship with God does this prayer teach and form in us?

- Simple, natural, open, and intimate
- Submissive
- Trusting and dependent

#### Our Father in Heaven

The Jews rarely called God Father before Jesus came. The whole nation of Israel was called God's son, and the king, representing the entire nation, was sometimes called God's son. But an individual would not call God "Father."

To the Jews, God's name was so holy they wouldn't even speak it. Those who copied scripture would take a bath before writing it. Yet here came this uneducated peasant calling God His Father. The Jews' response: *The Jews were seeking all the more to kill Him, because He . . . was calling God His own Father, making Himself equal with God.* (John 5:18, NASB)

Yet Jesus teaches us to speak to God the same way. In fact, we are encouraged to call Him "Abba," which roughly translates as "Daddy." Though we are weak and pitiful creatures living on a speck of dust in one corner of the universe, the great, transcendent Creator wants us to speak to Him in the most personal and familiar terms.

Since prayer is the breath of our relationship with God, how wonderful to address Him as *Our Father*! A warm, trusting relationship is established from the very beginning. What a privilege to call God by this simple, personal name!

When I call Him "Father," I am one-on-one, face-to-face with Him. Prayer is no longer the daunting task of trying to reach up and talk to an unseen Spirit way out there somewhere. Prayer is personal conversation, a quiet whisper directly from my heart to His. Simple. Warm. Intimate. He loves me. He is listening. I belong. I am welcome here.

This one I call "Father" is *in heaven* – ruling in the power center of all reality, high above, almighty, all-knowing, holy. And this One who is above all is Father to me. I can come to Him as a small child with all my needs, unafraid and in complete confidence.

"Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Luke 11:11-13, NIV)

When I come to God, He not only gives me what I need but also gives me His own Spirit. His gives me Himself. Somehow He joins His life to mine, enabling me to be the person He wants me to be. What a wonderful gift! What a loving Father!





honest and trusting.



#### **Our Daily Bread**

"Give us today our daily bread."
(Matthew 6:11, NIV)

When the people of Israel were traveling through a vast desert and were hungry, God gave them "daily bread" (Exodus 16:11-31). It was a flake-like substance called manna. Each morning they had to gather a supply for that one day. If they tried to keep enough for the next day, it rotted. But on the day before the Sabbath, they were to gather enough for two days. God didn't want them to have to work on the Sabbath.

Manna was a daily provision, sufficient for any need but impossible to hoard. God could have provided for their hunger any way He chose. Why would He choose this way? He was teaching them to depend on Him every day, one day at a time (see Deuteronomy 8:3).

Give us today our daily bread. Out of the entire Lord's Prayer, only this one petition covers the wants that normally fill our prayers. Doesn't this "one wish" seem small and unsatisfying? After all, most of us aren't worried about starving, at least not today.

We want more. We want enough to feel secure. We want enough to relax a little in what we have. God wants the opposite. He wants to keep us resting in Him alone. He will not grant His children any security outside of Himself.

Why? He knows that a constant, close relationship with Him is the key to our happiness and well-being. Daily dependence teaches and forms that relationship. None of us ever graduate from His school of dependence. He will not let you hoard everything you need, and you cannot see the future. Any security you think you've grasped is only an illusion. He will always and forever be your only security and your only supply. Even in the wealth and abundance of heaven, He himself will be the only source of every blessing.

If you care so much for your loved ones, imagine God's tender and constant concern for them.

#### **Christ Our Pattern**


